instructions include explanations of the various aspects of the exercise, along with modifications for less- or more-advanced bodies. The Theory volume consists of an introduction and nine additional chapters devoted to key theoretical issues regarding the dynamics of nuclear weapons (non) proliferation. Technological developments have enabled a dramatic expansion and also an evolution of telework, broadly defined as using ICTs to perform work from outside of an employer's premises. This volume offers a new conceptual framework explaining the evolution of telework over four decades.
